While you're here look up. Can you see the boat called Conrae II?

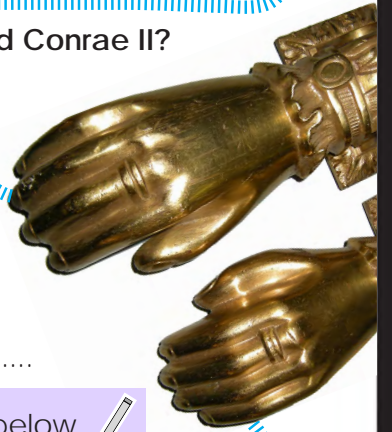
