

WAGGA WAGGA BOTANIC GARDENS

Lord Baden Powell Drive, Wagga Wagga NSW 2650

Wagga Wagga Botanic Garden is in the suburb of Turvey Park on a 20-hectare site on the south western slopes of Willans Hill Reserve. A sprawling site encompassing a mix of lawns, themed gardens, mini zoo, free flight aviary, two playgrounds and a large asphalt car park.

The Wagga Wagga Botanic Gardens site is gently sloping upwards from west to east, except for the music bowl which is a natural amphitheatre looking down towards the stage area. The site is well developed with plenty of pathways, road access and large shady trees throughout.

Access details:

Easy access for light vehicles to rose garden and car park. Overhanging trees along access route may cause height restrictions for heavy vehicles. Multiple pathways for easy pedestrian access. Access to music bowl stage is through a locked gate and down an unpaved slope, this may be slippery in adverse weather.
