

Road rehabilitation works in city centre to impact traffic conditions

Road rehabilitation works on Johnston, Church and Cross streets in our city centre are set to start on Monday 15 January, weather permitting.

Part of Council's major Road Rehabilitation Program, the works will be carried out between 6am and 7pm and are expected to take two weeks to complete.

The initial stabilisation of each street is expected to be completed by the end of the first week, with the new asphalt wearing course to be applied in the week, starting Monday 18 January, again weather permitting.

Manager Transport & Traffic Jamie Harwood advises there will be lane closures over this period, which will impact the flow of traffic and roadside car parking availability along these streets.

"Where possible, parking access will be permitted at the Wagga Beach carpark and Cross Street carpark," Mr Harwood said.

"If you're planning to visit the Wagga Beach or Riverside precinct or to attend church services or funerals at St Michael's Cathedral, St John's Anglican Church or St Andrews Presbyterian Church, please allow extra time to find parking.

"We understand these changes will cause some disruption to the community and apologise for any inconvenience it may cause.

"The rehabilitation of these roads is important as it will improve their quality and make them safer and smoother for the driving public."

Also scheduled to start on Monday will be the interim road maintenance works on Gregadoo Road between Plumpton Road and Plunkett Drive.

The temporary maintenance works involve rehabilitation of the existing road pavement and sealing the surface to last for approximately 12 months.

The is being delivered in three separate packages – two by contractors and the third by Council infrastructure and civil works teams.
