Community Development Coordinator Alex Osgood said "the Seniors Festival program is jam-packed, with over thirty low-cost or free activities," Council's Community Development Coordinator.

"The two-week festival program promises to bring together family, friends and community to spark conversations and strike up new friendships in safe, supported and inclusive public spaces."

"With approximately one-fifth (22 per cent) of our city's population aged 60 years and over," Ms Summerhayes said, "it is important to have a greater focus on finding ways for older adults to connect with others, and this is one of the key aims of the festival."
