

Notes

1. Remove all non native vegetation (other than those shown) along the lagoons' edge. Revegetate with native species (Dryland and wet filter plantings)
2. Screen fence with native vegetation
3. Remove all non native vegetation along the lagoons' edge. Revegetate with native species (Dryland and wet filter species) and include the use of rock to stabilise the edges
4. Boardwalk segments refer to the other lagoons on the Murrumbidgee floodplain
5. Footpath re-routed to remove grassed areas, providing a more direct path along the lagoon and encouraging greater interaction
6. Picnic table area/ family area. Incorporate chess set area as 'stage' for young children. Implement bubbler to this area
7. Reposition entrances and seats for greater surveillance into the sunken garden. Include additional lighting and replant corners of hedge. Remove grass and pave base of garden to lessen maintenance / water use
8. Relocate and update playground. Include equipment for specific age groups and appropriate softfall. Position beneath trees for shade
9. Replant area behind and around stage. Include Cedrus deodara plantings opposite those to the east.
10. Instate the rotunda as originally depicted by Kerr. Relocate Churchill tree and memorial.
11. Churchill memorial and tree relocated to this position.
12. Replant Poplar line with deciduous trees
13. Replant Anzac / Diggers Avenue with double line of Poplars and integrate landscaping around existing memorials to enable viewing both from within the gardens and as a part of the avenue. Take cuttings of existing Poplars and use as the first two trees at the entrance of the walk. Include lighting along the avenue to AS 1158.1
14. Construct a bookleaf wall (to match existing around cenotaph) with wording 'Victory Memorial Gardens Established 1928' along face of wall. Include evergreen hedge and annual plantings along the top of the wall.
15. Construct a bookleaf wall (to match existing around cenotaph) with wording 'Anzac (Diggers) Avenue Established 1932 Replanted 2007' Include a plaque within the wall to explain the significance of the avenue
16. Remove garden and relocate deciduous trees
17. Upgrade damaged memorial surroundings (paving lifted by tree roots)
18. Investigate the use of security gate at night to dissuade inappropriate use at night
19. Keep hedges to a level which allows views into the gardens from the street.
20. Investigate the relocation of the Swagman to the edge of the lagoon
21. Should additional memorials need to be located into the gardens, the area along Anzac/ Diggers Ave may be suitable
22. Investigate the lifting of paving under fountain and reinstating planting as per the original senses garden plan (Refer to plan of management)
23. Keep Waterfills in check to allow for areas of open water across the lagoon.

 - Within gardens: Calliandra dorrana, Chrysanthemum, Osmunda, Banksia magenta
 - Lagoon edge: Banksia magenta
 - Ornamental plantings (perennial and annual) (Refer to Appendix D for species list and street interval gardens)
 - Native grasses, ground covers and rock to stabilise lagoon edge:
 - Dianella tasmanica, Myoporum parvifolium, Anemone longifolia, Carex appressa, Juncus hastatus, Eriochloa spiciflora, Baumea articulata
 - Pelargonium australe, Anemobium alatum, Dactyloctenium aegyptium, Eriochloa spiciflora, Baumea articulata
 - Memorials (Refer to Figure 10 for location and dedication)
 - Park seats/ Picnic tables (Refer to Figure 11 for location and memory)
 - Existing lights (Additional lights proposed at the sunken garden and along Morrow Street. Refer to section 7.8)
 - Bin locations/ bubbler (to family area)
 - Existing paths/ Proposed paths
 - Grassed areas / Playground area
