

## Summary of Council's 29 January 2024 Ordinary Meeting

#### Council to express interest in participating in Al trial

Council endorsed the Notice of Motion calling for Council to join the Artificial Intelligence (AI) in NSW Planning pilot project to support councils in faster processing of development applications.

Council will write to the New South Wales Minister for Planning and Public Spaces Paul Scully MP expressing Council's interest in participating in the pilot project.

#### Application to change use of centre on Hardy Ave to childcare facility

Council resolved to approve DA23/0516 for the change of use of a centre located at 25-27 Hardy Avenue, Wagga Wagga, to a centre based childcare facility (72 children). The application includes associated alterations and additions and a revised carpark layout.

# Rezoning and reclassification of land located on Bowen Place and Boyd Place, Tolland

Council resolved to endorse the Planning Proposal LEP23/0001 to amend the Wagga Wagga Local Environmental Plan 2010 and submit it to the Department of Planning and Environment for Gateway Determination.

The proposal is to reclassify Council-owned land located on Bowen Place and Boyd Place, Tolland, which is currently used for laneways, to residential land.

Subject to endorsement of the Planning Proposal, Council will undertake public exhibition and consultation with a report to be prepared after the public exhibition period.

#### Offer of Drought Resilience Funding

Council resolved to accept funding offers from the Regional Drought Resilience Planning Program of \$200,000 for development of a Regional Drought Resilience Plan and \$250,000 for the implementation of the Regional Drought Resilience Plan.

The grants are co-funded by the NSW Government and the Australian Government's Future Drought Fund. This funding application was required to be submitted in conjunction with Lockhart Shire Council, in which Wagga Wagga City Council was nominated as the lead applicant.
