

Fee waiver for green waste from storm damage – statement from General Manager Peter Thompson

To help with clean-up efforts caused by yesterday's storm, green waste can be taken to the Gregadoo Waste Management Centre free of charge from Thursday 16 January to Sunday 26 January 2025.

The waste must come from the Wagga Wagga Local Government area, and anyone delivering green waste to the facility must provide proof of residency and sign a declaration that the waste resulted from the storm.

We ask residents to be mindful of contamination in any green waste.

Because there will be increased traffic at the GWMC, resulting in longer wait times at the weighbridge, we ask visitors to be patient and respectful of staff.
