Therefore monies are not spent incrementally but rather in response to these opportunities.

The Curator of Glass Michael Scarrone is currently in negotiation with artist Gabriella Bisitto about the acquisition of her major installation 'The Ocean Within', which comprises 40 x 500ml blows. This will be the major acquisition for 2009/10, with other works being acquired by donation or purchased by the Friends of the Gallery.

The final stages of the refurbishment commenced with AC&A Architects in Canberra working closely with a team of senior library staff. Plans were finalised for a new Family History hub to facilitate easier access to the extensive newspaper collection which covers 1865 - 2009 and is stored as microfilm. New signage is also in the design phase.

Highlight

The new layout was implemented in the last quarter - including face out shelves on both Library Levels, the reduction in height of shelves on Level 1 and the installation of new lights in strategic areas where necessary in the new layout. An intensive weeding program allowed the Reference Collection to be integrated into the main Non-Fiction collection. The new space was converted to the highly popular newspaper corner where many people gather each day. Customers have reported very positive feedback about how 'open and welcoming the library is' following the refurbishment.
